1. When posting on the class stream, address your message to who it is relevant to. This should be done in a formal way and not using text message style language.



2. Students are only to be posting on the class stream if they have a genuine learning question. For example, students shouldn't discuss each other's profile pictures, discussing what they are doing while they are at home or generally talking in a social way.
3. Students should be practising correct grammar and punctuation including capital letters and full stops. Writing using correct sentence structure. Using Google Classroom isn't an excuse to forget how we write informal scenarios.
4. If a question has been answered by someone, we don't need another person to answer the question again. Unless you believe someone has given a peer a wrong piece of information. Unless it is a discussion post made by a teacher.
5. When someone posts a question, the comments section should remain on topic. Google Classroom is not a chat room to just talk with friends and socialise.
6. If they have a question about a specific piece of work, add that comment to the section where that assignment has been posted. Don't make a completely new post about it on the stream. Students can also leave private comments on assignments for teachers to see if they don't want to ask the question in front of the whole class.

9. Please check the stream to see if the question you are about to ask, has already been asked by someone else and answered by a teacher or peer. This will mean students won’t need to wait for a response, the stream will be less cluttered and students’ questions won’t get missed.

10. You don't need to post in the stream to say you have completed a task. If you have completed something that has been set as an assignment. Simply "turn it in" this will tell us it has been completed.
